The 5 performances shall take place at our home of **The Riverside** on these dates: **Wednesday 22nd** - **Saturday 25th June** (7:30pm daily, 2:00 & 6:00pm on Saturday). The Dress rehearsal shall take place on **Tuesday 21st** and the Get In will be on **Sunday 19th** during the morning, after which a full run through of the show will go ahead. The Treasurer Writes:

Despite the considered decision to cancel 'Panto 22', we also were left with some production costs that had already been incurred. (scenery; rehearsal and early publicity costs). Not as large an amount as might have been, the sum of around £2,500 had to written off. This does however include £400 costs for the FRC hire for rehearsals, so overall is not a cost to the Company.

Fred Reynolds Centre:

We have applied for a further small Grant from the Council (£2,700) offered to cover for any Omicron effect on our FRC business and hiring. This is not related to the Panto cancellation but to the Pandemic effect on our FRC operation.

We do have calendar hiring space available at the moment, if anyone knows of people seeking a suitable venue (single hires or longer block bookings), then please give the telephone number a ring, details of which are on the Cof4 website and the new FRC Facebook page. Also, while we are on the subject of the FRC, if anyone has any spare time coming up over the next few months, we are always on the lookout for volunteers to help with gardening and maintenance of the building. This can be as little as a couple of hours a month, or more if you so desire! If you or you know of anyone who would be interested in lending a hand, please do get in touch.
